

Samantha Pavic is an architect, researcher, and Ph.D. candidate at the University of Zagreb. She holds degrees in Computer Science and Architecture from the University of Split and a Master's in Advanced Architectural Design from Columbia GSAPP.

Samantha's professional experience includes working on projects such as the 1976 UN Habitat Exhibition (curated by Mark Wasiuta, Felicity Scott, and Farzin Lotfi-Jam at Columbia GSAPP), the Zadar Airport Competition (1st Prize with Ante Kuzmanic Architects), and the Warsaw Transportation Hub (with Zaha Hadid Architects). She has also worked on large-scale developments in Asia and collaborated with artists like Ana Tzarev and designer Ron Arad.
