

BIOGRAPHY - Assistant Professor Snježana Perojević, Ph. D.

Graduated and got M.Sc. and PhD degrees at the Faculty of Architecture, University of Zagreb. At the FGAG Undergraduate and Graduate University Studies in Architecture and Urban Planning, she lectures the courses - Protection and Restoration of Architectural Heritage Studios 1 and 2; History of Architecture and Art 2 and 3 and History of Urban Form.

In addition to teaching, she is engaged in scientific research and professional work in the field of architectural heritage. The focus of work in the field of architectural heritage research is on the city of Split - its spatial development, especially the period when the city was under Venetian rule, with an emphasis on the Baroque period. Within this segment of the work, she also researches Diocletian's Palace in Split - its historical remains, but also its influence on the development of contemporary architectural and urban thought.

Significant interest is focused on the issue of modern interventions in architectural heritage, both its revitalization, conversions, and new construction within protected historical sites.

She pays special attention to the issue of sustainability related to architectural heritage: application of knowledge and experience from traditional construction; the elements and spatial organization of historical settlements related to the use of renewable energy sources; appropriateness and compatibility of new uses with the features of the space and impact of tourism on historical urban settlements - their space, inhabitants, quality of life and environment.
